

School or Child-related Groups or Education-related Governments Agencies:

Class 1: School or District Sanctioned Activities and Joint Use Partners use of school district, official parent organizations, or other groups directly connected with, or part of, the school district organization.

Examples:

- Regular classroom activities
- School sponsored activities for students (school clubs, intramural sports, etc.)
- Other school sponsored activities for parents
- School related groups and organizations (PTA, PAC, Dollars for Scholars, etc.)
- Entities with which the District has entered into a Joint Use Agreement
- Out-of-district school groups (student extracurricular groups, overnight visitors)

Class 2: Civic Services and Educational Organizations – user groups that provide direct benefits to the district, students, or the community.

Examples:

- Education related organizations: Educational Service Districts (i.e. meetings), State educational association meetings (WASA, WASBO, WSPA, etc.), Education related state agencies (OSPI, State Board of Education, etc.)
- Community Education activities, government sponsored and other free educational events, civic and service organizations providing direct support or service to children.
- Non-profit organizations conducting fundraising activities for charitable purposes (e.g., Ronald McDonald House, United Way, etc.)
- Chartered youth groups (e.g. Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, 4H, etc.)
- Authorized youth sports leagues (e.g. AAU, YMCA)
- College classes and activities
- Authorized adult recreational activities

Non-Profit Groups and Other Governmental Agencies

Class 3: Non-profit recreational and community-use, examples:

- City, county, and state agencies (other than educational)
- Non-profit organizations conducting non-charitable fund raising activities
- Non-profit organizations, civic and service groups who do not provide direct support or service to children. (e.g. neighborhood or citizen concern groups, political rallies and caucuses, etc.)
- Groups that enhance the community by offering arts and entertainment.
- Groups and clubs (e.g. Historical Preservation Society, Sierra Club, non-District labor unions, etc.)
- Religious organizations (for religious Sabbath services or other church-related activities for the local community)

Commercial/Private Groups

Class 4: Private Interest Groups (Local Community), examples:

- Fee-based events from the local community (e.g. recitals, lectures, sports and musical entertainment, etc.)
- Profit-making activities from the local community (e.g. financial seminars, sales, organization meetings, etc.)
- Family/student events (e.g. Quinceañeras, reunions)
